Families and Communities Together (FaCT) is a collaborative partnership among more than 60 community-based social services agencies, the Orange County Social Services Agency and Orangewood Children's Foundation. Since 1994, FaCT has provided support services to children and families through community-based collaborative operating Family Resource Centers. FaCT partners work together to build stronger families and prevent child abuse.

**FAMILY RESOURCE CENTERS**

Orange Counties 15 current community Family Resource Centers operate independently, and thus their programs will vary from site to site. Core services are common to all however and include: case management, parent education, resource referrals, advocacy, counseling, and domestic abuse intervention. Issues universally focused upon include: child development, child abuse and neglect issues, family health and wellness, family self-sufficiency, family literacy and community development activities. In support of those core services and focused issues of concern, the following are examples of some of the many supplemental programs and services that may typically be found at the individual Centers. Information and referrals offered to families and individuals needing emergency assistance. The site houses a legal aid office, EDD outreach, an ESL program and other services. Call Mon-Fri 8am-5pm for additional information.

The Center provides counseling and support on immigration problems and will assist with translations. A full seniors program, including a daily Senior Lunch, is also offered. Information and referrals, counseling, employment assistance, ESL, WIC and CSFP food programs, and outreach services are offered. Emergency food is available during office hours. A full seniors program, including a daily lunch (11:30am Mon-Fri) is provided. Office hours: Mon, Wed, Thurs, Fri, Sat, 8am-5pm and Tues 8am-8pm.

**Families Forward** 9221 Irvine Blvd, Irvine (949) 552-2727  
Families Forward is a non-profit agency dedicated to helping low income and homeless families in need. The agency offers valuable programs and resources designed to alleviate the pressures that struggling families face day to day. Families Forward addresses families' needs at any point in their crisis by providing a broad spectrum of services, including: housing, counseling, emergency food, education, case management, life-skills training and rent or utility assistance. A Food Pantry serves more than 5,000 individuals yearly. Food is distributed on Tuesdays and Thursdays by appointment only, and is open to any South County resident in need. Recipients receive a variety of fresh and nonperishable food items. Also offered is a 90-day to 18-month transitional housing program designed to help families that have lost their housing. Private housing for each family is combined with individual and group counseling and a self-determined action plan to meet goals in the areas of employment, housing and family. Families must be committed to working with the staff counselors, achieving goals and moving toward true self-sufficiency.

Emergency food and limited financial assistance for shelter, utilities, and other basic needs are provided, subject to funds being available. Funding for bus passes and prescriptions may also be available. Gasoline vouchers can be provided for confirmed doctor's appointments or job interviews. Clothing vouchers are also issued. Referrals and information are available for other needs. **EMERGENCY SHELTER** is available at Hospitality House in Santa Ana, with limited TLC Housing at their Buffalo Street facility. Motel vouchers are **NOT** available.

Info and referrals to meet basic supports are provided. Emergency food (USDA & FEMA) is available. Immigrant services focused on the Hispanic community are offered including immigration, document preparation, and visa processing and translation. Onsite ESL classes, citizenship workshops and leadership training seminars. Senior programs also onsite. Mon-Fri 9am-5pm.

South County Outreach, in support of Homeless Prevention, provides assistance to South County families through a food pantry and payment of utility and rental assistance to avoid eviction or utility shutoff. A transitional Housing program is also available, offering a 6-9 month program to help homeless families achieve self-sufficiency and permanent housing. Also, SCO's Computer Learning Lab provides free computer training for those unemployed or under-employed seeking to improve job skills.
